

Cable wranglers


A neat alternative to bongo ties, Velcro straps, and the like. Compact and neat, each of these wranglers hold two or three cables in a flexible plastic.

\$20 for one, \$35 for two, and \$10 for each one beyond that.

Cable wrangler Hoss

A two-part wrangler for the end of a 15mm rods with ½-13 threads (like M2, Zacuto, etc.)

The design intent with the Hoss wrangler was to keep the cables off the rods and therefore make telescoping the monitor or battery is less frustrating.



Cable wrangler Ben

Because not all rods have a ½-13 thread at the end, the Ben wrangler was designed to clip (or slip) onto any 15mm rod.

Ben is also made in a version for .620 rods (for U2, Shadow, Panavision, etc.)



Cable wrangler Adam

This wrangler gets screwed to the top, or to the underside, of a dovetail plate.

It's very useful when used with a long dovetail plate (like one of Peter Abraham's Zalex™ Longplates). When used on top of the dovetail, the grabber can be rotated to any position. The thread has a Helicoil™, and it is supplied with a ¼-20 SHCS and a special washer to fit the slots on the underside of the dovetail plate. It can also be fastened to other parts or accessories with a ¼ inch through hole.



Cable wrangler Little Joe

Having an “offset” design, Little Joe mounts to the top of a dovetail plate, but with a lower profile than the Adam wrangler. Alas, it does *not* fit in the slot on the underside of the dovetails like the Adam wrangler.
